DOWNHOLME SIGNAGE

Hudswell & District Parish Council have recently managed (after much cajoling) to get the road signs re-erected in Downholme. The original request included the replacement of the road signs on the stone plinth on the main Leyburn to Richmond road, and the sign on the stone plinth at the cattle grid on Downholme Moor. The National Park responded:

"Could I start by making a plea for the retention and repair of the two wall-mounted village name plates please. They are rare survivals of signage of the early days of motor touring – the alluminium plaques with clear projecting lettering and glass ball reflectors, set low down in relation to the road level, could date from the 1930s and continued to be made into the '50s. While not listable they have increasing heritage significance as they are features of the early days of motoring and survive often only in rural areas."



Needless to say negotiations are ongoing and we're currently trying to find funding for the repairs.

However, the sign that was at the cattle grid has disappeared – **DO YOU KNOW WHERE IT IS?** Please, if you have found it, could you return it as soon as possible?

NEWS FROM THE WOODS – SPRING 2015

There's plenty of mud about but aside from the odd day of snow it seems like we have had a reasonably dry winter. At least that's what we have found in parts of Hag Wood where we have way-marked a new permissive route through the wood. The path follows a steep diagonal line to Scarcote/Kirkgate Wood before looping around to the NE corner of our boundary, and from there it's just 50 yards east along the Richmond-Reeth road (A6108) to the Public Rights of Way across Underbank. Access to the top of Hag Wood is provided by the Hudswell-Downholme Permissive Path. Hag Wood is different to much of Hudswell Woods; birch and oak dominate above the crags and paths are little more than deer tracks. Much of Hag Wood is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, mainly because of its invertebrates and bryophytes (mosses and liverworts). Ground-nesting migrant warblers also use the woods and we ask that dogs be kept on leads between April 1st and 31st July to avoid disturbance.

In Calfhall Wood our woodland management work has continued this winter, you may have noticed the creation of a woodland clearing to benefit oak and wych elm regeneration, as well as the flush of woodland flowers, and associated insects that will benefit from increased light levels.

We have also had activity on the grassland this winter. In the absence of cattle grazing the riverside meadows we have had the very welcome assistance of three Shetland ponies. Grazing and ground disturbance is an important part of the meadow restoration process, many of the coarser tussock forming grasses have now been eaten back and the pony's hooves have created areas of bare ground and trodden in flower seed that was spread at the back end of last summer. We intend to take the ponies out between the middle of April and early June to allow the flowers to bloom and set seed. Although the transformation will take time it may well be worth walking down in May to see how the restoration process is doing and which wildflowers have benefitted from the winter grazing.

It won't be long now before migrant warblers return from Africa and southern Europe. The first chiffchaff is truly a sign that spring is underway. If you are down by the riverside it's also worth watching out for (or listening for the chatter of) sand martins as they make their way up the Swale to their regular nesting sites. We are running a bird song walk from Round Howe car park on the 17th May if anyone is interested in brushing up on their bird song identification through the woodland. If you have ever wondered what the birds are that are singing around Hudswell then do let me know if you are interested in an early morning walk around the village, I would be happy to organise that this spring. Other events this spring include an Easter Egg hunt on the 4th April and an introduction to geocaching (a kind of treasure hunt with a GPS) on the 8th April, look out for the posters for more information.



SPEEDING TRAFFIC

Vehicles speeding into and out of Hudswell remain a concern of the Parish Council. 30mph is the MAXIMUM permitted speed in the village NOT THE MINIMUM. The Parish Council has tried several ways to get vehicles to keep below 30 mph without much success.

Now it has been suggested that VAS (Vehicle Activated Speed) Matrix signs could be tried. However, this is expensive at a cost of £9,000 for 2 Matrix on a four year contract. To meet this cost the parish precept, part of the Council Tax, would have to be increased by 200 per cent for the four years. *Please indicate your preference by returning the slip on the next page to the Parish Clerk.*

The simple solution is PLEASE, PLEASE KEEP YOUR SPEED BELOW 30 MPH FOR THE SAKE OF OUR CHILDREN.
